Indo Pacific 2023: Navigating the Seas of Innovation and Collaboration

The Indo Pacific International Maritime Exposition 2023, held at the International Convention Centre (ICC) Sydney from November 7-9, brought naval and maritime defence communities together for three days of innovation, collaboration, and strategic discussions.

With Extel proudly standing among the 832 exhibitors, the expo emerged as the region's premier maritime and naval defence showcase. Notable developments included the successful trials of the Speartooth Large Uncrewed Underwater Vehicle for the Royal Australian Navy (RAN) and BAE Systems' modification to the Hunter-class frigate design.

Day 2: Unveiling Innovations and Forging Partnerships

On the second day, the expo continued its momentum, revealing groundbreaking innovations and fostering collaborations. Japan made its debut appearance at an Australian defence industry exposition, showcasing technologies from 10 companies.

Life h2o, a Darwin-based company, marked its success in the Australian defence market with exports of innovative water purification equipment to the Philippines. Lockheed Martin's development of a Patriot surface-to-air missile variant added another layer of technological prowess to the event. Press releases highlighted partnerships, including L3Harris and Sentinel Boats showcasing autonomous systems capabilities on Sydney Harbour.

Day 3: Culmination and Future Prospects

The final day of Indo Pacific 2023 brought the event to a close, with a wealth of statistics underscoring its significance. The expo boasted an impressive 19,000 square meters of exhibition space, drawing over 27,000 attendees from 52 nations and featuring 176 delegations. The international community was well-represented, with 13.15% of international visitors contributing to the global dialogue.

As Indo Pacific 2023 drew to a close, eyes turned towards the future. Indo Pacific 2025 has been scheduled for November 4-6 at the ICC Sydney.
